

Thunder Bay Airport to Temporarily Reduce Select User Fees

April 28, 2026

The Thunder Bay International Airports Authority will temporarily reduce select airport user fees from May 1 to May 30, 2026, to help airlines manage rising jet fuel costs.

The move comes amid increasing fuel prices and tightening supply, placing additional pressure on airlines. The fee reductions are intended to support reliable air service and preserve essential connectivity for Thunder Bay and Northern Ontario.

“This is a practical step we can take right now to support our airline partners and the passengers who rely on them,” said Graham Ingham, President and CEO. “We recognize the challenges airlines are facing and are committed to maintaining stable, accessible air service for our community.”

The fee reductions will be applied automatically to scheduled commercial flights operating through Thunder Bay International Airport during the month of May.
